COURSE DESCRIPTION

The **Executive Summer Course Beyond CSR: Leadership for Social Innovation** addresses professionals from private companies, NGOs, international organisations and the public sector who would like to:

- Understand the major aspects of CSR and how it contributes to institutions meeting global sustainability challenges and opportunities;
- Enhance their leadership skills to become innovative responsible leaders;
- Master the latest CSR cutting-edge tools and strategies;
- Boost their company value.

Learn how to integrate CSR at the core of your organisation through a dynamic and interactive course combining lectures, group exercises, case studies and exchanges with peers. Take advantage of the exclusive international networking opportunities Geneva has to offer in the sustainability area.

Who should attend?

Managers in charge of CSR activities, CEOs, board members, consultants and executives in private companies, NGOs, international and public institutions.

The **Executive Summer Course Beyond CSR: Leadership for Social Innovation** is organised around a self-paced introductory e-learning module followed by a 5-day intensive classroom session in Geneva.

Classes take place every day from Monday June 19 to Friday June 23, 2017, from 9 am to 5 pm. They consist of a mix of lectures, case studies, group exercises and presentations. They give participants the opportunity to share and discuss their own CSR experience, projects and challenges and get feedback from peers.

Speakers include leading academic and professional CSR experts from the private sector, United Nations specialised agencies, Non-Governmental Organisations and think tanks.

Diploma awarded

A Certificate of Attendance will be delivered by the University of Geneva to participants attending the Executive Summer Course. Participants who successfully complete the required examinations will receive a Certificate of Completion that represents 6 ECTS credits (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System).

Language

The Executive Summer Course in CSR Leadership is taught in English.

Admission requirements

A recognised University degree or equivalent, or significant professional experience.

Fees

- CHF 3,700.- for the complete programme
- Early bird: CHF 3,370.- for applications received by **1 March 2017**
- CHF 750.- for single day(s) attendance (register at least two weeks before)

The fees include the welcome dinner, coffee breaks, lunches and the CSR Summer Drinks. Participants are responsible for their own travel and accommodation arrangements and expenses.

Geneva taxpayers can benefit from a "Chèque-Formation Emploi" of up to CHF 2,250.- that can be obtained under certain conditions.
